.Emma Lewell-Buck Emma Lewell-Buck (née Rice) (born 15 June 1977) is a British broadcast and print journalist, working for the BBC. Early life In 1997, Lewell-Buck was named Business Journalist of the Year at the prestigious BAI Media Awards. Lewell-Buck was educated at Scaitcliffe School for Girls, where she was head girl and won the Daily Telegraph's Young Woman of the Year Award in 1995. Lewell-Buck studied media and history at Somerville College, Oxford, where she was President of the Oxford Union and graduated with a First. Career The Press Association After graduating, Lewell-Buck joined the Press Association as a trainee, and after two years she became a reporter. She was later promoted to become the political editor of the PA's London Evening Standard edition. Lewell-Buck was subsequently promoted to become the political editor of the PA's national newspaper, The Times, a post she held until 2013. BBC News Lewell-Buck joined the BBC in July 2007 as a reporter for BBC News, becoming the bureau reporter for Afghanistan. Subsequently, in February 2010, she joined the BBC's China service as its Beijing correspondent, before moving to its Tokyo bureau in August 2012. She returned to London, in December 2012, to work for the BBC on new regional news programmes for Northern Ireland and Scotland. She has also been the Northern Ireland correspondent for a BBC series called The Big Issue. Lewell-Buck also writes a political column for the BBC website. Awards Lewell-Buck has twice won the Thomson Reuters Foundation Journalism award for her reporting on Afghanistan, and in 2010 she was awarded the Robert Fisk/Muslim Public Affairs Committee prize for her human rights journalism in Afghanistan. In 2011, she was named Young Journalist of the Year at the British Journalism Awards. Personal life Lewell-Buck married the MP and former British Army officer Nick Buck in 2011.
